

N1JEZ, Mike Seguin:

Mike was first licensed in 1991. He immediately became interested in VHF operation and spent time contesting with WB1GQR on Mt. Equinox in southern Vermont. After a few years, he was bitten by the satellite bug. Since then, he has earned WAS, WAC, VUCC, DXCC and numerous other satellite awards. He was fortunate to make the first transatlantic 24 GHz satellite contact via AO-40 with G3WDG. When AO-7 sprang back to life a number of years ago, Mike used one of the few existing 'command encoders' to demonstrate that the satellite was still able to be controlled. As an AMSAT member, Mike maintains the official "AMSAT Frequency Guide". Mike is active on all bands from 6M through 241 GHz. During the VHF contests he now usually operates as N1JEZ from his camp in FN44ar. As a radio broadcast engineer for over 35 years, Mike has worked on equipment from "DC to Daylight". His current interests are vintage analog audio gear, microwave equipment above 47 GHz, SDR and GPS systems.
